



Kidzone caught up with creator and author of The Deep, Tom Taylor.

KZ: The Deep is back For Season 4! What can viewers expect?

Tom: More adventure! More fun!
More pirates! A mystery bigger than
anything we've seen before involving
Ant and Fontaine's grandparents.
And Jeffrey the fish will steal every
scene as usual.

KZ: What's new with the Nekton family in Season 4? Has Ant dreamt up any new ways to annoy fontaine?

Tom: Of course. But Ant has really graduated from annoying his sister (though she provided invaluable practice) and he's far more keen to annoy people who would treat the ocean poorly ... and pirates like Mad Madeline, of course.

KZ: Do you hear from fans of The Deep from around the globe?

Tom: We do. It's wonderful. We see fan art, and hear from lots of people who love the Nekton family — from parents and younger audiences. We hear from grandparents who watch it with their grandkids and parents who say their kids watch it on repeat every day.

KZ: What inspired you to create the original The Deep graphic novel series?

wanted to create a good comic for my own kids. Something exciting and funny that parents would want to read WITH their children. And I've always been fascinated with the ocean. It's huge. Tom: It's what we hear from fans. It's the people this show makes happy. That's definitely the best part.

### KZ: What is your favourite ocean creature?

Tom: The colossal squid. It's amazing.

#### KZ: What do you hope the audience learns From The Deep about caring for our oceans?

Tom: I hope that the Nektons show how important our oceans and our world are. How important it is to preserve natural treasures like the Great Barrier Reef. And how hard we should work to combat climate change, and keep the oceans full of life and full of incredible mysteries forever.
